

Cleaning Up After a Hurricane

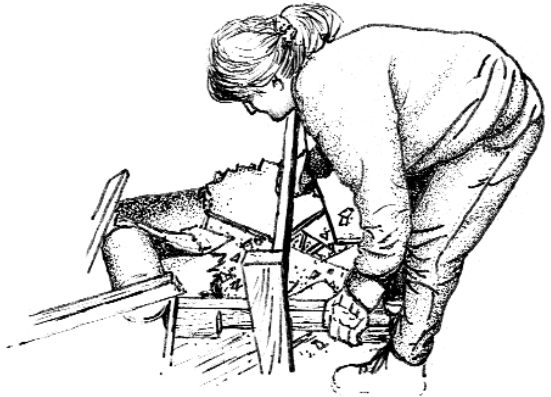
Remember, it is your responsibility to remove debris from your property after a major storm or hurricane. Move the debris to the curb and it will be removed by a disposal service from your city or county. Debris pick-up schedules will be publicized through your local radio, television and newspaper after the storm.

At the curb, separate debris from your property into four piles:

- trees and branches
- construction materials
- appliances/furniture
- hazardous materials.

Place loose leaves and small vegetative debris in clear plastic bags for recycling.

Be careful of power lines. Make sure the debris that is ready for pick-up is away from telephone poles, utility boxes, fire hydrants, fences and mailboxes.



Be patient. Removal services may be delayed due to a heavy volume of debris.

Depending on the extent of the hurricane, the demand for trash and recycling services may be overwhelmed for some time. Immediately after the storm, avoid delivering waste directly to any city or county run transfer station or other facility. Listen for updates through local radio and television stations.
